Christians (/krɪstʃen, -tien/) are people who follow or adhere to Christianity, a Monotheistic religion (Yahweh/God) based on the life and teachings of Jesus Christ.



Most of us that receive this publication and read this article wold call themselves a Christian. I believe the definition above challenges us, or should; mostly the adhering to the teachings of Jesus. The challenge comes from a myriad of places:

- · What exactly did Jesus teach?
- Can we follow His teachings today?
- What does that look like in our life structure?
- Are we willing to balance our life's choices against Jesus' teachings?

The best place to find what Jesus taught is The Sermon on the Mount found in Matthew beginning in chapter 5 and concluding in Chapter 7. While other information can be found within the totality of the four Gospels; Mathew, Mark, Luke and John, along with Acts of the Apostles, the sermon Jesus taught on top of the mountain, covers the spirit and intent of what God wanted for his people and from his people. Jesus wasn't just sent to die so you could go to Heaven but to change us into a people that could receive the Kingdom of God with Christ as Lord here on earth. While the language maybe be over 2000 years old, the heart of his lesson holds true TODAY!

Jesus taught that we are to be representatives of Jesus in the world (:13-16), and that rule following doesn't accomplish the mission, (5:17-20.) Life change is required so Jesus helps us understand we are not to harm people in anyway, with physicality or words to them or about them (5:21-26,) commitments to others MATTER! We should honor them, always (5:27-38.) We are not asked or entitled to carry out judgement and vengeance in the name of God, by doing so we get in God's way but the best way to "kill an enemy is to make them into a friend. (5:38-48)

Besides wondering what we shouldn't do, taking care of others in need is our biggest task and be humble about our life in giving. (6:1-4) Communicating with God; prayer is key to staying on course. We ask for God to work in our lives, the lives of others for the will of the Father. Humility is the hallmark of communication with God. It helps us to remember that God is the supplier, God is holy and that our main goal is for the Kingdom of Heaven to overtake the Kingdom of Earth. That is how we all WIN and overcome the pitfalls of earthly life: whether it be scrambling to be prosperous in hearthside while forgetting God WILL provide. (6:5-34)

God is holy and remember that all of God's creation is as well, even when they forget and act otherwise. But by focusing on the Kingdom of Heaven we will want what God wants for us and that is always perfect and pleasing, but requires a narrow focus that isn't prone to earthly distractions or side routes promoted by people trying to make God in a human image that warps God's will and the teachings of Christ. You will be able to tell the difference if their actions truly line up with these teachings which is true life's stability! (7:1-29)

Re-reading this sermon often can provide checks and balances to our life today.
