

### Imago Dei & the Theory of Unlearning

Imago Dei; a Latin term meaning image of God is a term I used the last Sunday in my sermon. I now wish I had planned to spend more time to unpack and understand the term. Another sermon for another day. The term was originally brought into focus by Thomas Aquinas in the 13th century. He felt like virtuous persons are formed in a lifelike portraiture of Creator. He based this on a deep, prayerful understanding of scripture; (particularly Genesis 1:26-27, Colossians 3:10, Genesis :6, 2 Corinthians 4:4, and Hebrews 1:3)

*“This biblical passage does not imply that God is in human form, but that humans are in the image of God in their moral, spiritual, and intellectual essence. Thus, humans reflect God's divine nature in their ability to achieve the unique characteristics with which they have been endowed. These unique qualities make humans different than all other creatures: rational understanding, creative liberty, the capacity for self-actualization, and the potential for self-transcendence.” [christianity.com](https://www.christianity.com) 2023, March 21, 2022.*

The term not only means we are created in the spiritual image of our Creator and God is self-actualized through humankind, the term has a further meaning. The term also refers to God's care for humans. Humans have special qualities that allow for God to work in and through humans. The care of God for all humans show in the chain of love and care. We love God - God loves us and make Himself known in us which shows love for God's other Created that have yet to enter into this chain of shared love; Holy Love.

While this concept was documented in scripture within the 1st century, it was twelve centuries before anyone dug into the deeper implications and documented the insight the help teachers of the Word to better instruct and guide the followers of Christ. People had to begin to unlearn the superficial knowledge and understanding they had been taught and relearn something more rich and abundant,

What you see here is what happened within the Sermon Series BE Attitudes we just completed. It was an exercise of “unlearning.” Unlearning is when you take the embedded knowledge you have accumulated over the years and allow yourself to hear deeper and more thorough understandings. Most of us have learned the Beatitudes; possibly many times. But taking the time to truly dig, prayerfully and with discernment to find a richer and more encompassing understanding, all the while being willing to consider adopting the understanding. This is what Aquinas did through the understanding of “Imago Dei.”

Unlearning also causes us to check and recheck things we “think” we know. Example: I had always studied and learned that the recidivism rates for Tennessee was 93%. I had looked it up to be certain, What I missed was that was **second time**, felons. The state of Tennessee's 46%. Although this rate does not include misdemeanor statistics which does significantly raise

the 1st time offender statistics. This re-reading, studying and correcting is called “**unlearning.**” It is important to know, unlearning is replaced by new learning, not just ditching what you thought you knew.

Unlearning takes so much more effort. It involves reading, studying and most importantly, prayer and discernment. God gave us a brain to use and people that have done a lot of work before us to look at to better understand God’s intent for us! Unlearning is part of Imago Dei. As those created in the image and living with God in us and working through, we will be compelled to know what God wants of us. Taking the time and effort to pray, learn and know, as opposed to complacently exist with superficial understanding keeps us from truly living into Imago Dei.
