February is often the month associated with love, care, romance and matters of the heart. Recently on our Abide movement, one of sermon scripture stands out. ""No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends." John 15:13 I believe that to be true I believe that as Christians, we are called to be in compassion, and redemptive concern for our friends and neighbors. And if we lift our heads and look around, we will take notice that we have friends, family, and community members in our country that are hurting and struggling. It might even be YOU. Sadly, our response is too often ignoring people who are struggling, even if it's our self, we don't take the time to care, not because we don't care or we lack empathy. It is most likely we avoid the vulnerability of humanity. Helping others in a weakened state, or allowing people to help you, makes us admit we are vulnerable. Often, we don't want to take the time to give ourselves the time to be cared for or to care for ourselves, let alone someone else that we know. Maybe we're not sure how to help or enter in to their distress. Yet there is no greater love but to lay down our life for another; to sacrifice our needs for the needs of another. we are called to carry their burdens with them. I believe that, in order to care for others we must first care for ourselves. You can't pour from an empty cup. Giving ourselves compassion, love and care may make our hearts more fertile to care for others. If we are already caring for others, it will give us the strength to continue.

What if we use this month to begin a practice of caring for ourselves first to give us the strength, the energy and the compassion and understanding to know when and how to care for others? Below is a self-guided meditation for rest found in Christ; by Abiding. I urge you to spend 15 minutes a day engaging in this practice to put your heart and your soul in a better place, so you can receive and give help other; to fill your cup, as you begin to pour into others,

## Focus on God's Word:

"My child, be attentive to my words; incline your ear to my sayings. Do not let them escape from your sight; keep them within your heart. For they are life to those who find them, and healing to all their flesh." Proverbs 4:20-22 NRSV

- How do you prevent your soul from getting sick? Maybe you care for your health by taking vitamins and exercise and getting in the sun.
- Take a deep breath. Like you are breathing that fresh air outside on a beautiful warm spring day. Hopefully, you do something each day to
- take care of the health of your body but what do you do to care for the spiritual needs of your body? The passage above has some tips to help us find ways to care for ourselves; our souls each day.
- Reflect on that passage again. Here is a different version. "Dear friend, listen well to my words; tune your ears to my voice. Keep my message in plain view at all times. Concentrate! Learn it by heart! Those who discover these words live, really live; body and soul, they're bursting with health." Proverbs 4:20-22 MSG

Just like daily vitamins, take time to pray daily. Not just when you need something, or there's a problem. But take time to seek Christ daily. Spend time with God through His Son. This will help you develop a deep connection with God and give you the ability to be vulnerable and inform him of your concerns and your fears. Practice preventative prayer. Much like yearly physicals for your health, spending time with God regularly, allows us to work on problems before they are out of control. Spend a few minutes right now. Just relaxing in gods

## Pray:

Almighty God, we realize that we don't know what the future holds, but we are thankful that we know who holds our future. Help me pay attention to what's going on on the inside and not just what's going on on the outside. God, you know my heart so help me know those places that are hurting and need healing and then Lord I invite you in to those places to bring about that very healing.

## **Persecuted Christians**

Please remember the following in your prayers.

**Father Isaac Achi & Father Collins Omeh**: served as priests at Saints Peter and Paul Catholic Church in the Diocese of Minna. At 3:00 am, armed assailants set the church rectory on fire. Father Achi perished in the blaze. Father Omeh escaped the burning building but sustained gunshot wounds & was hospitalized. (Karin Koro, Nigeria)

Ahamada Mafabi: (37 yrs.) was killed after participating in a Muslim-Christian debate on January 2. A former Muslim who converted to Christianity in December 2020 after meeting many times with a pastor, Ahamada became instrumental in setting up several religious debates over the past couple of years in his community. The debates were very successful as a reported 100 people converted — on the evening he was murdered 13 people came to Christianity. He survived 4 previous assassination attempts by Muslims & is survived by a wife & 4 children aged 3-14 yrs. old. Uganda's constitution affords religious freedom to both proselytize & change one's religion. Christianity is the largest religion in Uganda (84%) & Islam is the largest minority religion (14%). (Mbale, Uganda)

Good news! A federal judge recently ruled that exempting religious colleges from Title IX to avoid interference with their religious convictions is "substantially related to the government's objective of accommodating religious exercise." The plaintiffs, The Religious Exemption Accountability Project, are considering an appeal of the ruling & seek to have the religious exemption declared unconstitutional.
